



1950s Scenery Highlights

The two short film productions are based on novels by Kosakai Fuboku who was from Kanie.

[Kosakai Fuboku]

Kosakai Fuboku was a mystery writer from Kanie. He wrote during the 1920s, and is said to be a pioneer in the world of Japanese detective novels. Although he passed away suddenly at the age of 38, he left behind over 140 stories that are highly acclaimed in the mystery world. It is said that he had a large influence on Edogawa Ranpo and Yokomizu Seishi.

[Synopsis]

One stormy night, monk Osho and an apprentice Hoshin hear a suspicious noise coming from the main hall of their temple. The two of them must investigate in the pitch dark, relying on the light of a single wax candle. 


5 Film Set

Zenkyo-ji Temple



Kanie was historically a coastal town and currently features six rivers. In addition to natural landscapes, Kanie is home to bridges, temples and shrines, some of which were included in the original Japanese version of the film. Zenkyo-ji Temple, where the movie was filmed, is located along Kanie River.

[Synopsis]

In 1950s Japan, after graduating from medical school, Doctor Terada has some thoughts on end-of-life care. He returns to his hometown of Kanie and opens a small clinic. Some years later, he has earned his reputation as a master physician, but fate steps in and the joke is on him.

Nikko River embankment

This scene was filmed along a strip of the Nikko River embankment. This is Kanie's widest river, which you can see gently flowing in the background of the shot along with a mountain range in the distance. Depending on the season, you can find old-fashioned Japanese pampas grass growing tall.

Former social services center

The former social services center in this scene is a public facility in Kanie. The furniture and tools used in the clinic on set are real and were once used in Kanie.

Funairi neighborhood

Kanie is dotted with many small side streets and alleyways which lends a retro look to the landscape. This area used to have a fishing port, so visitors may encounter particularly unique scenery.



9 Clinic Scene 2

Former Funairi community center

The scene in front of the clinic was filmed at the former Funairi neighborhood community center. There are still many buildings like this in Kanie.
