Let's keep to the garbage collection days and times and separation rules!!

- Any garbage placed in plastic shopping bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected. **Always place your garbage in the municipality's designated garbage bags!!**
- Wash bottles and cans and dispose as recyclable garbage. Do not place them in garbage bags for burnable garbage or plastics!!
- **Reservations are needed for the collection of furniture and other oversize garbage!** Reservations can be made up to one month in advance, so be sure to book in plenty of time (Tel: 0567-95-1111).
- Never put spray cans in garbage bags! Empty completely and dispose as recyclable garbage.

Used Small Home Appliance Recycling	
We recycle valuable metals contained in home appliances.	
Disposal date and time: Daily (excluding the New Year's holidays), 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.	
Disposal site: Honmachi Eco Station/Gakuto Eco Station	
Items: Home appliances used in everyday life that are powered by electricity or batteries. (Only those that will fit inside a non-burnable garbage bag.)	
Examples of acceptable items	Personal computers (accepted at Eco Stations or by the manufacturer), digital cameras, printers, game consoles, mobile telephones, microwave ranges, DVD decks, electric fans, vacuum cleaners, etc.
Examples of non-acceptable items	The six appliance types covered by the Act on Recycling of Specified Kinds of Home Appliances, fan heaters, lightbulbs, electric blankets, lighting fixtures, speakers (wooden), batteries, etc.
